The safety training is very important as well as the communications training which helps the group on the ground be able to always communicate with the operator.

Operators of heavy machinery are highly trained workers who can diagnose, troubleshoot and repair heavy equipment on site or in a workshop. It might be possible for delivery drivers to get work with just a CDL, though for some jobs, certain endorsements may be needed. Like for instance, delivering huge pieces of equipment or components which are exceptionally large for construction projects would need the driver to finish further training in order to handle and haul huge loads. Usually, the drivers operate along with chaperone vehicles that are driven by trained drivers. These chaperone vehicles usually escort the delivery truck to its destination.
